## Personalised Learning

Facilitators are encouraged to speak to learners to gain further insight into their needs and preferences regarding content and learning styles. We collaborate closely with stakeholders to understand and focus on the specific academic areas they require, ensuring our teaching aligns with their academic goals.

Each learner receives a detailed profile created by our Academic Team, including information such as current grade, target grade, special educational needs (SEND), and specific focus areas. This ensures that each lesson is personalised to meet the learner's academic and developmental needs. Profiles and academic information are updated and provided to facilitators once the course has been set up.

## Initial Assessments

Baseline tests are an integral part of our planning process, helping us understand each learner's starting point and tailor our teaching strategies to improve their learning outcomes. Individualised learning plans are developed based on baseline assessments and specific areas of difficulty identified in the Course Brief.

Recognising that some traditional tests do not accommodate various SEND needs, we adjust our baseline assessments to suit individual learner requirements. For example, we may remove the time limit to reduce anxiety, portray the questions in an interactive quiz format, or incorporate them into a discussion with the learner.

Facilitators are required to assess each learner's needs before the lesson and select the most suitable method to ensure the assessment is effective and supportive. This personalised approach ensures that all learners, including those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), are accurately assessed and given the best opportunity to succeed.

For learners who are non-native English speakers and cannot provide previous English proficiency test scores, Purple Ruler will administer an English Proficiency test within the first session to assess their language skills. The results of this test will be used to plan lessons and tailor instruction to the learner's language abilities. If adequate previous data is unavailable, the cost of the test will be charged to the Local Authority (LA) for referred learners, or to the parents/guardians for those enrolled individually.

Our curriculum includes robust safeguarding protocols to ensure the safety and security of our learners. This encompasses strict visitor access protocols, mandatory background checks, and supervision for all digital interactions. Our digital literacy programme emphasises online safety, teaching learners about secure use of digital tools and responsible online behaviour. We utilise secure platforms like Lark and Lessonspace, ensuring that all digital interactions are monitored and protected.

## Curriculum Structure

The curriculum at Purple Ruler is designed to provide a comprehensive and balanced education that meets statutory requirements and supports the holistic development of learners. Full-time supervised education is provided for pupils of compulsory school age, in accordance with section 8 of the Education Act 1996. This approach ensures that, as far as is reasonably

practicable, pupils gain experience in linguistic, mathematical, scientific, technological, human and social, physical, and aesthetic and creative education.

Our curriculum aims to reignite and cultivate learners' natural curiosity and enthusiasm for learning. We strive to boost learners' self-assurance, self-worth, and academic self-belief. - **Combined Science:** Offers a comprehensive study of Biology, Chemistry, and Physics, focusing on scientific inquiry and critical thinking.
- **Personal, Social, Health, and Economic (PSHE) Education:** Addresses topics like health, relationships, and economic understanding, integrating socio-emotional learning and life skills.
- **Physical Education (PE):** Emphasises physical fitness, health, and wellbeing through theory and movement sessions.
- **Geography:** Learners explore physical and human geography, environmental issues, and global interconnections, with a focus on fieldwork.
- **History:** This subject examines significant events, periods, and figures, emphasising critical thinking and analysis.
- **Psychology:** Introduces learners to the scientific study of the mind and behaviour, promoting understanding of psychological theories.
- **Business Studies:** Offers practical knowledge about business, including entrepreneurship, finance, marketing, and management.
- **Citizenship Studies:** Teaches civic responsibilities and government structures, emphasising the role of citizens in a democratic society.
- **Computer Science:** Develops digital literacy and technological proficiency through computing and information technology.

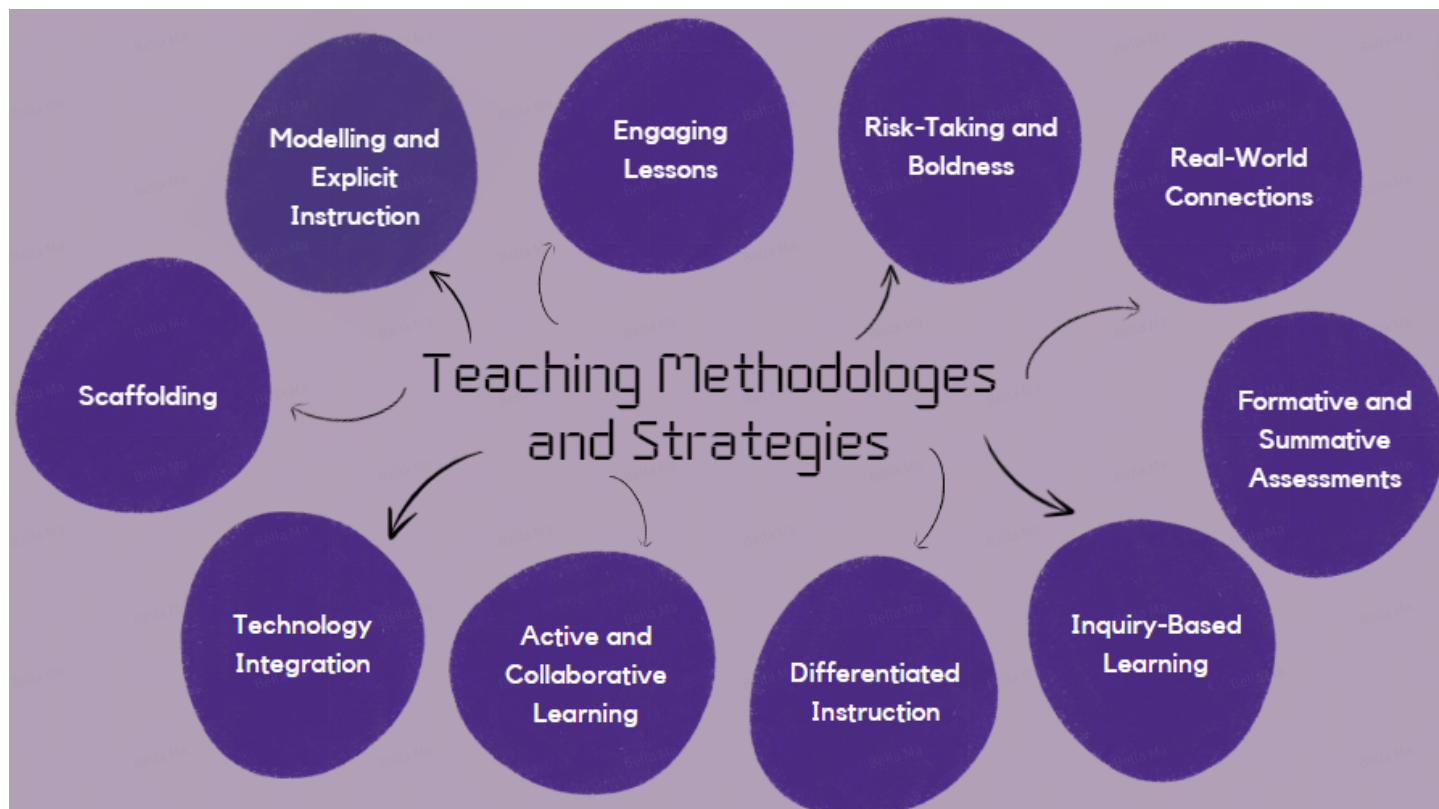
## Teaching Methodologies and Strategies

Our teaching methodologies and strategies create an engaging and effective learning environment that supports the diverse needs of our learners. We employ a variety of approaches to ensure that each learner can thrive academically and personally. Key strategies include:

- **Modelling and Explicit Instruction:** Facilitators demonstrate problem-solving or analytical thinking processes step-by-step. This involves teaching facts and foundational knowledge, explaining their significance and application, and guiding learners to apply what they have learned to new and unfamiliar questions. For example, in a Maths lesson, a facilitator might solve an equation step-by-step on an interactive whiteboard, explaining each step and its importance, then guiding learners through similar problems before gradually increasing complexity. This method helps learners build a strong conceptual understanding and develop the ability to think critically and independently.
- **Engaging Lessons:** Lessons are meticulously planned to stretch learners, ensuring that the content is appropriately challenging and stimulating. The Test Teach Test method is used to assess learners' understanding at the beginning and end of each lesson, allowing facilitators to tailor their instruction to meet learners' needs effectively. For instance, a facilitator might start a Science lesson with a pre-test to gauge prior knowledge, then teach the new content, and finish with a post-test to assess understanding and identify areas needing further development. This approach helps identify areas of strength and areas requiring further development.
- **Risk-Taking and Boldness:** Learners are encouraged to step outside their comfort zones, take risks, and tackle challenges that may initially seem daunting. Facilitators inspire learners to be bold and brave, fostering an environment where mistakes are viewed as learning opportunities and resilience is built. For example, in an English class, learners might be encouraged to share their stories, receive constructive feedback, and revise their work, learning to view criticism as a growth opportunity.
- **Real-World Connections:** The greatest achievements in learning occur when learners can recognise and understand the connections between concepts and the real world. By relating academic content to real-life situations, we make learning more relevant and engaging, helping learners see the practical applications of their studies. For instance, a History lesson might involve analysing primary source documents from historical events, allowing learners to connect the past with current societal issues.

- **Inquiry-Based Learning:** This approach encourages learners to ask questions, conduct investigations, and develop solutions, promoting active learning and critical thinking. Learner-led investigations and project-based learning activities allow learners to explore topics deeply and engage with the material in a meaningful way. For example, a facilitator might assign a project where learners research and present on a current environmental issue, encouraging them to develop their own questions and seek answers through investigation.
- **Differentiated Instruction:** Teaching methods are tailored to meet the diverse needs of learners, including those with SEND and SEMH challenges. This includes using tiered assignments, flexible grouping, and personalised learning plans to provide targeted instruction that caters to varying abilities and learning styles. For example, in a History lesson, learners might be given different tasks based on their interests and abilities: some might create a timeline of events, others might write an essay on the causes and effects of a specific event, while others could produce a multimedia presentation. Each task is designed to challenge learners appropriately and engage them based on their strengths and interests.
- **Active and Collaborative Learning:** Group work and peer-to-peer learning are emphasised to develop communication, teamwork, and leadership skills. Activities such as debates, role-plays, and peer reviews encourage collaboration and help learners learn from each other. For instance, a Citizenship class might involve a debate on a historical issue, allowing learners to argue different perspectives and learn collaboratively.
- **Technology Integration:** Digital tools and resources are seamlessly integrated into teaching and learning. We use virtual labs, simulations, multimedia resources, and online platforms to create engaging and interactive lessons. For example, in a Biology lesson, learners might use a virtual lab to simulate genetic experiments. Our digital literacy programme also includes lessons on cyberbullying, data privacy, and responsible online behaviour, ensuring learners are proficient in digital skills and understand the importance of online safety.
- **Scaffolding:** Guided practice gradually builds learner understanding and independence. It involves assessing learners' current knowledge, providing foundational support, and using structured activities to help them apply new concepts. Over time, facilitators reduce support as learners gain proficiency, offering continuous feedback and encouraging self-reflection to foster independence. For example, in a science class, a facilitator might start with a detailed demonstration of an experiment, then guide learners through a similar experiment in pairs, and finally have learners design and conduct their own experiments independently. Each stage includes feedback and adjustments to ensure learners are developing their skills and understanding progressively.

- **Formative and Summative Assessments:** Ongoing assessments are used to monitor learner progress and inform instruction. Summative assessments evaluate learning outcomes at the end of instructional units. Feedback is timely and constructive, encouraging reflective practices and supporting continuous improvement in learner learning. For instance, a Geography facilitator might use weekly quizzes to gauge understanding, provide feedback, and adjust instruction, while end-of-unit tests assess overall comprehension.



By providing a curriculum that is both comprehensive and adaptable to individual needs, we ensure that every learner is equipped with the knowledge, skills, and values necessary to succeed in an ever-changing global society.

## Assessment and Reporting

The Assessment and Reporting section outlines the methods and processes used at Purple Ruler to evaluate the learner's learning journey, track progress, and communicate outcomes to learners, parents/guardians, and other stakeholders. This ensures that assessment practices are thorough, consistent, and aligned with the school's educational goals. It also emphasises the importance of feedback and continuous improvement, ensuring that learners receive the support they need to succeed.

At Purple Ruler, we employ a comprehensive assessment framework designed to monitor learner progress, inform instructional practices, and support learner's learning journey. This framework includes:

1. **Formative Assessment:** Regularly assessing learner understanding through quizzes, classwork, homework, and informal checks for understanding. Immediate, constructive feedback helps learners identify areas for improvement and set learning goals. Formative assessment data is used to tailor instruction and address individual learner needs, ensuring support throughout their learning journey. These assessments allow learners to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding, providing insights for facilitators to adjust lesson structures to suit learners' abilities, pace, and needs. It is difficult to provide a timeframe for these assessments as they can be conducted at any point in the course through fun quizzes or homework, making the process flexible and responsive to learners' needs.

#### **Feedback on Formative Assessments:**

- **Verbal Feedback Within Lessons:** Real-time, spoken feedback during lessons to address immediate concerns and guide learners.
  - **Automated Feedback:** Instant feedback on online quizzes, including explanations of correct and incorrect answers, discussed during class sessions.
  - **Peer Feedback:** Structured opportunities for learners to give and receive feedback from classmates, fostering collaborative learning.
  - **Feedback in Lesson Reports:** Comprehensive feedback provided in lesson reports after sessions, summarising performance and offering actionable steps for improvement.
2. **Summative Assessment:** These are conducted at the end of instructional units to evaluate learner understanding and mastery of the material covered throughout the unit. These assessments are crucial for measuring how well learners have assimilated the knowledge and skills taught during the course.

All summative assessments are aligned with the expectations set out in the national curriculum for Key Stage 4 (KS4) and adhere to the guidelines provided by the GCSE examination boards (e.g., AQA, Edexcel). This alignment ensures that learners are assessed against national standards, preparing them effectively for their GCSE examinations. The assessment criteria are meticulously designed to reflect the rigor, content, and structure of the final GCSE exams, providing an accurate measure of a learner's readiness for these crucial assessments.

The summative assessments also incorporate a variety of question types and assessment methods mirroring those used in GCSE exams, including multiple-choice questions, short-answer questions, and extended writing tasks. This comprehensive approach not only evaluates the breadth of a learner's knowledge but also their ability to apply that knowledge in different contexts, a key skill assessed in the final exams.

#### **Types of Assessments:**

**Half-Term Assessments:** Informal tests administered at mid-point intervals to gauge learners' knowledge and understanding up to that point. These assessments help to identify



areas where learners may need additional support before the end-of-term evaluations.

**End-of-Term Assessments:** Conducted at the conclusion of each instructional term, these assessments evaluate learners' understanding and mastery of the specific content covered during the term. They provide immediate feedback on the effectiveness of the instructional methods and help guide further adjustments if needed.

**Half-Yearly Examinations:** Formal tests conducted at the end of April to evaluate learners' understanding of all material covered up to that point in the academic year. These assessments provide a comprehensive review of learners' progress and highlight areas for further development.

**Yearly Examinations:** Formal tests held in July to assess learners' cumulative knowledge and skills acquired throughout the entire academic year. These examinations offer a thorough evaluation of learners' overall performance and integration of the year's content.

### **Feedback on Summative Assessments**

- **Detailed Assessment Reports:** After major assessments or final exams, provide a comprehensive overview of learner performance, including strengths, score breakdown, and areas needing improvement via email. This offers learners a detailed view of their overall performance.
  - **Class Feedback:** During an online session, provide feedback on overall class performance by addressing common trends, discussing frequent errors, and offering general guidance.
  - **Annotated Copies:** After assessments are completed, provide direct, specific feedback on individual work by annotating digital copies with comments and corrections. Share these annotated copies with the learner in the next online session.
3. **Baseline Tests:** Conducted in the first or second lesson to assess prior knowledge and understanding of the subject. These initial assessments provide facilitators with valuable insights into learners' existing knowledge and skill levels. Facilitators analyse the results to identify the strengths and weaknesses of each learner, which is crucial for designing effective and tailored lesson plans.

Baseline tests help facilitators pinpoint areas where learners may need additional support or targeted instruction, allowing them to adapt their teaching strategies to better meet individual needs. This targeted approach ensures that lessons are designed to address specific areas for improvement while reinforcing existing strengths.

Baseline tests are adjusted to accommodate SEND needs by removing time constraints for anxious learners, increasing text size, and incorporating questions into engaging formats like fun quizzes rather than formal tests. This approach ensures that all learners can demonstrate their prior knowledge comfortably.



In cases where summative assessments are not conducted (e.g., in PSHE or PE), learners will take an additional baseline test later in the course to measure their acquired knowledge. The results from these tests will be included in the lesson report after class and used to evaluate learner progress and attainment. This data is instrumental in refining lesson plans and adapting teaching methods, ensuring that each learner's needs are met effectively throughout their educational journey.

4. **Feedback and Learner Voice:** Learners are taught that homework, summative assessments, and in-class tests are conducted for their benefit, not the facilitator's. Any feedback given to learners should be positive, encouraging, and aimed at enabling learner progress. Marking should be constructive and provide clear directions for improvement.
5. **Communication of Assessment Outcomes:** Effective communication of assessment outcomes is crucial for supporting learner progress and involving parents in the educational process. Purple Ruler employs several reporting mechanisms:
  - **Weekly Progress Reports:** Weekly reports are sent every Friday, offering stakeholders a general overview of learner attendance, lesson content, behaviour, and facilitator feedback, along with a brief, encouraging note to boost the learner's confidence. The live document is updated daily and accessible anytime with an assigned password, providing stakeholders with regular and up-to-date information on the learner's progress.
  - **Detailed Progress Reports:** Comprehensive reports are sent termly to outline the progress and attainment that learners have made thus far, including any necessary adjustments. An annual report is sent at the end of the academic year, detailing the learners' learning journey, overall progress, and achievements.
  - **Parent-Teacher Conferences:** Organised termly to discuss learner progress, strengths, and areas for development, with opportunities for individual consultations to address specific concerns and develop action plans.

**Examination Preparation:** Exam access is coordinated with the schools or local authorities with whom learners are enrolled, ensuring all logistical aspects are managed efficiently and learners are well-prepared for their examinations.

## Annual Progress Report

The Annual Progress Report at Purple Ruler is a comprehensive document designed to provide a detailed overview of each learner's academic and personal development throughout the school year. This report is integral to ensuring that learners, parents or guardians, and facilitators have a clear understanding of progress, areas for improvement, and the next steps required to support ongoing success. The Head of Academics will oversee the writing of the annual progress report by the academic team.

The report includes the following key sections:

## 1. Core Subject Attainment

The report covers the learner's progress and attainment in all core subjects, including English, Mathematics, Combined Science, and any elective subjects chosen by the learner. Each subject report includes:

- Performance Summary: A breakdown of the learner's performance in key areas such as reading, writing, mathematical reasoning, and scientific inquiry. This section provides a clear picture of the learner's achievements in each core subject.
- Comparison to National Benchmarks: An analysis of the learner's performance against national benchmarks, including GCSE grade expectations or equivalent standards. This comparison helps parents/guardians or LAs to understand how their child's achievements align with the national curriculum standards for Key Stage 4 (KS4). It offers insights into the learner's standing relative to peers across the country, aiding in setting realistic academic goals.
- Areas of Strength and Improvement: Specific feedback on the learner's strengths in each subject is provided, alongside targeted areas for improvement. This section includes suggestions for resources or strategies to support further development, ensuring that both learners and parents/guardians have actionable guidance to enhance academic performance.

## 2. Overall Academic Development

This section offers a holistic view of the learner's academic growth throughout the year, highlighting how their progress aligns with Purple Ruler's educational aims and values. Emphasis is placed on the development of critical thinking, creativity, resilience, and other key competencies that are central to our educational philosophy. The report also reflects on the learner's progress across the curriculum, not just in core subjects, ensuring a well-rounded evaluation.

## 3. Personal Development and Engagement

Beyond academics, the report evaluates the learner's engagement in online lessons and participation in class activities. This review is shared with the Local Authority (LA) to ensure that all statutory requirements are met, and that the learner continues to receive the support they need to thrive. The report details how the support strategies outlined in the EHCP have been implemented and their impact on the learner's progress. It also includes recommendations for any adjustments to the EHCP for the following year, ensuring that the learner's needs are continuously met.

## Assessment Process

**Initial Assessment:** Baseline tests, conducted in the first or second lesson to assess prior knowledge, help facilitators identify weaker areas and plan future lessons accordingly. These tests are adjusted to meet SEND needs and are essential for understanding each learner's starting point, allowing us to tailor teaching strategies to enhance learning outcomes.

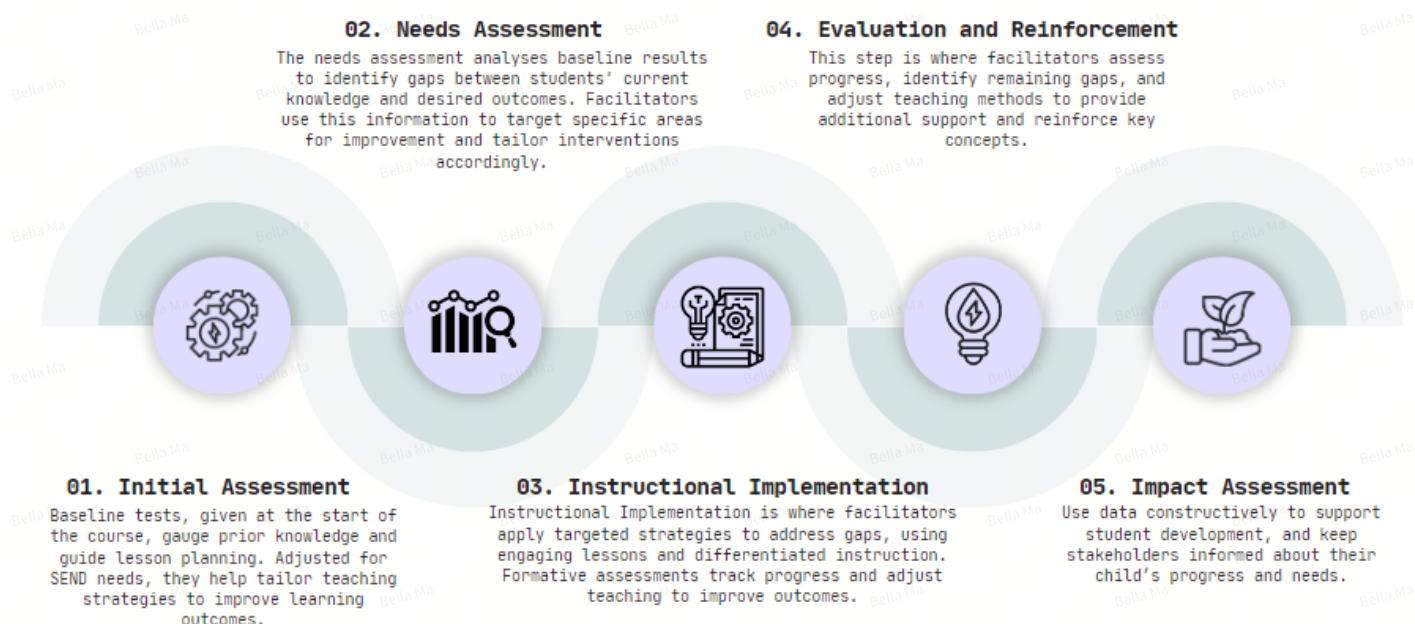
**Needs Assessment:** This involves identifying and evaluating discrepancies between learners' current knowledge and desired learning outcomes. By analysing baseline test results and other performance data, facilitators can pinpoint specific areas where learners are struggling. This process helps in understanding the gaps in knowledge and skills, enabling the development of targeted interventions and tailored lesson plans to address these needs and bridge the gaps effectively.

**Instructional Implementation:** Facilitators put targeted strategies and interventions into practice based on the needs assessment. Facilitators deliver lessons designed to address identified gaps, using various instructional methods and resources to engage learners and reinforce key concepts. Differentiated instruction ensures that all learners, including those with SEND needs, receive appropriate support. Regular formative assessments help monitor progress and adjust teaching approaches to enhance learning outcomes and keep learners on track to achieve their goals.

**Evaluation and Reinforcement:** This involves assessing learner progress to see if learning goals have been met. Based on these evaluations, facilitators identify areas needing further support and adjust their teaching methods accordingly, providing additional assistance and reinforcing key concepts as necessary.

**Impact Assessment and Communication:** Learner progress is assessed and areas for further support are identified. Data should be used constructively to help learners build on their successes and learn from their challenges, rather than reinforcing underachievement. This information is then shared with stakeholders to keep them informed and engaged in their child's development.

### Subject Facilitators

- Monitor each learner's progress through assessments with clear success criteria. Learners should understand how to improve.



- Complete end-of-lesson reports promptly with quiz scores and details on learner engagement.
- If progress is insufficient after feedback, intervene with strategies like additional practice or explanations.
- If no improvement occurs, notify stakeholders and work with the Head of Academics to create a support plan.
- If issues persist, arrange a meeting with stakeholders to discuss progress and strategies, led by the Head of Academics for subject-specific issues or broader concerns.

Purple Ruler's commitment to monitoring and supporting learner progress ensures that all learners have the opportunity to succeed. Through consistent assessment practices, targeted interventions, and collaborative efforts between facilitators, the Head of Academics, and stakeholders, we strive to foster an environment where learners can overcome challenges and achieve their academic goals. ## British Values

- **Presentation:** Evaluating the presentation of the lesson, facilitator, and material. This includes ensuring the facilitator encourages all learners, engages with the material, and uses resources appropriately. The facilitator's setup and background should be professional.
- **Learner Interaction and Enthusiasm:** Assessing the facilitator's ability to establish a strong connection with learners and design material that engages them, even with disabled microphones and cameras. Ensuring consistent use of appropriate Concept Checking Questions (CCQs) and Instruction Checking Questions (ICQs).
- **Facilitator Energy, Communication, Passion, and Motivation:** Evaluating the facilitator's energy levels, use of positive reinforcement, and classroom management techniques to inspire and encourage all learners. The facilitator should use excellent vocabulary and maintain consistent energy throughout the session.
- **Content Level and Understanding of Learner Needs:** Assessing the facilitator's understanding of content requirements and goals. The facilitator should effectively use the intro lesson to bring the course together, deliver content with scaffolding, build on prior knowledge, simplify concepts, and adapt where needed.

The Quality Assurance process is integral to staff personal development in several ways:
